Local Law #3-2014 was unanimously adopted.

Supervisor Jacangelo stated that the town board had copies of the 2015 Tentative Budget at last months meeting and since that time, he has made adjustments and there now is a 0% tax increase. C. Roberts, Town Accountant was present to answer any questions the board or audience may have had. Elected officials salaries were discussed as well as appointed officials and the general rule was that most officials got a 2% increase. The salary of the Assessor's Clerk/Code Enforcement Clerk was reviewed and it was decided that she would be receiving more than a 2% increase. Also personal services were discussed in the justice line. Supervisor Jacangelo also reported that he would like to convert the town hall from oil to propane.

Because of the recent resignation of P. McKenna, Judge Kronau will be the sitting judge for the remainder of the year and will be holding court every Monday until the end of 2014. The Town Board decided because of the extra work involved that Judge Kronau will be paid a stipend of \$678 a month until the end of 2014.

RESOLUTION #28-2014-IN THE MATTER OF THE TOWN BOARD AUTHORIZING A STIPEND FOR JUDGE G. KRONAU IN THE AMOUNT \$678 PER MONTH THROUGH THE END OF 2014

Motion by Hass, seconded by Slavin to pay Judge Kronau a stipend of \$678 a month for the last three months of 2014.

Councilwoman Ross wanted to thank C. Roberts, town bookkeeper for all of his help during this budget process.


RESOLUTION #29-2014 - Motion by Slavin, Seconded by Ross to accept the Preliminary Budget for 2015 as discussed this evening.
